New place. Lost job. Three kids. On the brink. Then Gary found St. Vincent de Paul.

Gary had tears in his eyes as he expressed these words of thanks to the people who provide support to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

Gary came with his wife and children to Madison on the advice of a family friend. They had been living in Texas, barely making ends meet. Then the pandemic hit, and job loss followed.

Gary believed a good job and a stable life for his family would be waiting in Madison, but when they arrived, the friend was nowhere to be found. They found shelter in a local hotel but knew their limited funds would not last long. Gary looked for help wherever he could find it. A Facebook post led him to the St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry.



She arranged a home visit with Gary and his family to see what other needs they could help meet. The conference helped the family secure an apartment and continues to aid and encourage Gary and his wife.

Clothing vouchers usable at the St. Vinny’s Thrift Stores ensured the family had warm clothes going into winter. A furniture voucher made their new apartment more like home.



Combined value of life-saving medications for Donny and Harold

Caring: Our Pharmacy's Best Medicine

Dane County patients find the St. Vincent de Paul Charitable Pharmacy in a variety of ways.

Donny sometimes visited our food pantry to stretch his income from two part-time jobs and learned about the pharmacy at a pantry visit. **Harold** lost his health insurance following his divorce and couldn't afford his medicine. A friend suggested the charitable pharmacy.

While a pantry client, Donny learned he has diabetes. "I was feeling weird," Donny explained. "My vision was blurry. I didn't feel right. I was gaining weight." Donny went to the doctor.

"My blood sugar was so high, they didn't even do the other tests," Donny said. "I had a low form of health insurance and couldn't afford the medicine. My doctor said not to worry. He had already called in meds to St. Vincent de Paul. Right away I was able to get insulin."

"I also used the diabetic food boxes from the pantry for a while. My health is better since I came to St. Vincent de Paul. My insulin is reduced to a real small unit. I've lost over 60 pounds and might be able to get off of insulin if I get my weight down some more."

Harold's thyroid condition made his medication essential. "When I got divorced, I lost insurance," Harold said. "I also needed medicine for high blood pressure and cholesterol. It was all just too expensive to afford."

Then Harold learned he also has diabetes. "The pharmacists and other staff are always helpful. They connected me with a nurse to learn better nutrition and made sure I had all the meds I needed."

Harold also credits the pharmacy for helping him avoid surgery. "My doctor wanted me to go under the knife for my prostate, but the medicine I get from St. Vincent de Paul has helped me avoid that."

The medicines Donny and Harold receive would cost **\$6,400/month**, more than either of them could afford to pay. Both are grateful they receive free medications but are even more thankful for the care and compassion they have experienced.

"Life would be harder and I would be struggling without St. Vinny's. I love coming in to see everybody. It feels like a family. Your assistance changes lives."
